Charleston's oldest independent culinary establishment on Queen Street, serving fresh Lowcountry cuisine in a beautifully restored Victorian house, perfect for brunch and dinner.

Firefly Distillery: Charleston's most visited distillery nestled among live oaks and Spanish moss, offering a variety of innovative spirits, including the world's first Sweet Tea Vodka. A charming setting with live music on Saturdays.





Prohibition: Rustic-chic Modern
American restaurant with a Jazz Age
theme, where you can indulge in
inventive cocktails and sophisticated
spins on Southern classics, including a
casual tasting menu paired with dealer's
choice beverage pairings.

The Cocktail Club: Stylish speakeasystyle bar on Charleston's upper King Street, offering craft cocktails, housemade infusions, and a rooftop terrace with a custom garden, all within a historic building featuring reclaimed wood and original accents.
